R.Donnan, a former Evanston player, joined the Warriors and went three-for-three, with two singles and a triple. Rudin and N.Hobbs each had two hits, and the other Warriors either got on base or hit the ball sharply. Our fielding was excellent, with no fielding errors. We had a diving putout at the plate by catcher Joey Carmichael, a catcher-to-third putout on an attempted steal, and a perfect play on a very high fly ball by S.Cleave in left field. B.Levine, J.Keeley, and P.Kohnken handled in-field, outfield and catching duties. Our base running continued to be aggressive, with many steals and good sliding. — *Coach Don Rupert*

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: Only six Glencoe players showed up, so we exchanged players, used coaches, and played a true pick-up game. For the Warriors, excellent outfielding was turned in by Coach Alan Rudin; Glencoe Blue's Coach Don Moran also made some good outfielding plays. (Too bad Major League scouts weren't present: contracts would have been awarded.) Because of the pick-up nature of the game, we really didn't keep accurate totals of hits, steals, etc. However, Skokie's K.O'Connor hit a sharp line drive between center and right for a solid double. The game was concluded after six innings, when several Skokie and Glencoe players had to leave for soccer matches. — *Coach Don Rupert*
