PITCHERS USED (INNINGS PITCHED): K.Jackman (2), R.Kuhns (2), P.Collins (1)

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: The A's struggled early, giving up two runs in the first and four in the second. In the first, K.Jackman walked three, struck out two, and got the third out on a ground out. In the second he walked the first batter before giving up a triple. He finished the inning with two strike outs and four walks, with R.Kuhns entering the game to nail down the last out. The A's were down by six runs but came back in a fury starting in the bottom of the second with four runs on singles by Kuhns, Topping, and Collins, then a two-run double to left field by Snyder. Choi and Jackman singled, with Snyder crossing home before Kuhns drove in the last run of the inning. In the third inning, hits by Snyder, Cascia, Kuhns, and Collins, with great base running by Kuhns and the walks of Jackman, Choi, and Topping, netted the A's another five runs and the lead, which they never relinquished. Kuhns, pitched a very strong two innings with P.Collins virtually shutting down the opposition in the 5th. - Coach Andy Jackman

PITCHERS USED (INNINGS PITCHED): C.SanRoman (2), C.Almeroth (2), K.Jackman (?), Pratt (?)

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: The A's suffered their first loss of the season against a very strong New Trier Orange team. A's pitchers SanRoman, Pratt, and Jackman pitched well, but solid bats and sharp base running gave the advantage to the Orange. After a 5 run first inning, A's pitchers limited the Orange to 5 runs over the 2nd through 6th innings. The A's started to rally in the 5th and 6th, scoring on hits by Almeroth, Cascia, and Kuhns. Strong pitching from the Orange closer shut the A's down in the 7th. Expect to see the A's jump back quickly next week. - Coach Andy Jackman

PITCHERS USED (INNINGS PITCHED): Salah (2), Garvey (2), Jackman (1), Collins (1), Kuhns (1)

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: The Glenview A's pitching staff turned in a great performance, beginning with two strong innings from Salah. The highlight of the first inning was a double play on a caught ball by shortstop Berens with the runner on first thrown out. Salah struck out three. Garvey befuddled the opposition with an assortment of off-speed pitches, and Jackman in one excellent inning of play forced a fly-out, struck out another and threw out a runner leading off third. Collins pitched a scoreless inning of devastating fastballs, striking out two swinging, grounding out one. Kuhns closed out the game, striking out two and grounding out one. There was plenty of offense in the game with Cascia driving in 4 runs on two hits, Kuhns driving in two runs in the seventh, and Pratt and Garvey each driving in a run. Collins however was the most prolific A at the plate making it on base in all four plate appearances with two walks and two hits, including a huge triple in the fourth. PITCHERS USED (INNINGS PITCHED): Salah (1), Berens (1), Jackman (2), SanRoman (1)

GAME HIGHLIGHTS: The A's struggled early again this week, but showed their mettle with a gritty comeback attempt that was cut short of the win. Of note were two standout innings from Jackman and one from SanRoman as the two aces allowed only two runs over three innings. In the 4th, Jackman faced only three, grounding out the first and striking out two, while SanRoman, in the 5th faced only four, forcing a fly out, a ground out, and striking out one. The A's offense faced a tough right hander in the first and second innings, mustering on one run, and though the bats started connecting in the 3rd, the A's had only scored two runs in three innings of play. Suddenly in the

fourth the A's started making noise. The inning began with Kuhns taking a walk and scoring on a scorching double to left by Collins. Pratt drove in one and Ameroth stole home on a passed ball, and with the bases full, a walk brought in a fourth run. But with two outs SanRoman was sent on the steal of third base and called out on a very close play. In the fifth the A's continued to rally, with a hit from Cascia who then proceeded to steal all three remaining bases. The rally was cut short at two the final score A's 10, Pirates 12.

**PITCHERS USED (INNINGS PITCHED):** Collins (1), Cascia (1), Berens (1), Kuhns (2), Jackman (2)

**GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** An exciting game between the A's and the Cubs which was finally decided on a 1 and 2 count line drive with two outs in the final inning. A tremendous effort by A's shortstop, Cascia, who, though fully extended, could not snag the sharply hit ball which skitted into left center, allowing the winning run to cross. This game was a defensive struggle, with both teams getting great performances from their pitching staffs. For the A's, Collins faced three, recording two ground outs and a strikeout in the first. Cascia followed in the second with a ground out to first and two strike outs, stranding one. Berens then struck out one, grounded out two in the third. The bottom fourth inning began with the score at 4 to 2 after Collins stole home in the third and drove in a run off a double in the top of the fourth. Jackman continued to shut down the Cubs hitters in the sixth, finally surrendering the go ahead run in the 7th, when he induced the batter to hit a grounder to short that barely made it through.
