It's advisable to have a spotter to ward off foul balls. If you're visitors, then there's some space south of the right field fence, east of the Port-A-Potty. Again, a spotter is advisable.]

**GAME HIGHLIGHTS:** A mostly well-played close game decided by a run scored by the Skokie Indians Storm in the 6th inning in small ball fashion: a couple of walks, stolen bases and S.Mendelson scoring when B.Sklena sprinted to first base after a dropped third strike and the first baseman's overthrow back to the plate. A.Murphy broke out of a brief slump with a clutch, 2 RBI single in the first inning, with the Storm scoring 3 times in each of the first two innings, and a double in the 5th. The Storm felt fortunate to score against the New Trier Brown's tough 13 year old pitcher S.Patereos and his awesome curve ball. A.Chernoff, B.Sklena (returning from his dislocated elbow injury suffered at Cooperstown) and D.O'Malley had clutch hits in the 3 run second inning for the storm. D.Goodman was 2-for-3, A.Chernoff 2-for-2, S.Kincaid had a clutch RBI sacrifice fly in the 5th as the game went back and forth. Storm pitching was a little inconsistent at times, but M.Felvey was strong in relief of T.Chalem in the first two innings and A.Murphy dominant as the closer in the 6th and 7th. For New Trier Brown, Borre (2nd inning) and Tanner (3rd inning) had long doubles with Brown, Patereos and Donnaire clutch hits in the 2-run New Trier Brown 5th to tie the game. In the field, Storm highlights included two awesome plays by D.O'Malley at shortstop, with New Trier Brown turning a slick double play in the 3rd and a great play by the second baseman in the 6th to save a run on a shot hit between 1st and 2nd. **WINNING PITCHER:** A.Murphy.
