NOTES:

1. The winning team gets two points, the losing team gets zero points, and each team gets one point for a tie.
2. Teams with more points in their division receive higher seeds. In case of an identical record, the team with the better record against the other team gets the higher seed. If the teams have the same record, then the NSYBA Commissioner flips a coin to determine the higher seed.
3. Each division plays a double-elimination tournament to determine the pennant winner. The two pennant winners play in the three-game NSYBA World Series to determine the NSYBA Champion.
4. The higher seed retains home field advantage during the entire course of the pennant race. Wherever possible, the home team will start on its home diamond, but bear in mind that limited diamond availability will prevent this frequently, especially on weekday pennant games.
5. American Division seeds 4 and 5 play their first playoff game on Saturday, June 19, 2004. American Division seeds 2 and 3 play their first playoff game on Monday, June 21. American Division seed 1 plays its first playoff game on Monday, June 21, against the winner of the game on Saturday, June 19.
6. National Division seeds 6 and 3 play each other on Saturday, June 19. National Division seeds 4 and 5 play each other on Saturday, June 19. National Division seed 1 plays the winner of the 4-5 game on Monday, June 21. National Division seed 2 plays the winner of the 6-3 game on Monday, June 21.
