Message from the Coach:

At times it wasn't the prettiest of seasons, but certainly the most fun team I have ever been a part of. Our Summer Ball team finished with a solid 17-4 record, which included a 13 game winning streak. I'd like give a special thanks to assistant coach F.Kruk for lending his amazing instructional baseball coaching tips to not only the players, but also to me. I've learned a lot from F.Kruk through the long Spring and Summer seasons and will certainly pass on his knowledge to future teams that I hope to coach. We were a much improved baseball team from the beginning of the season until the final game of the year, and much of this improvement is a credit to the coaching skills of F.Kruk. I'd also like to thank assistant coach W.Farrell, Sr., for being at nearly all our games, even when his son was unable to make it. At times when we were short handed with coaching, W.Farrell, Sr., assisted in helping coach 1st base, helped keep the scorebook, assisted with pre-game warm-ups, and of course bringing the water cooler to all those hot and humid days. I'd also like to R.Wiederer who helped coach 1st base when he was available and also gave some of our pitchers some great pitching instruction. I'd also like to give thanks to St.LeVine who helped keep the scorebook whenever he was available. Lastly, I'd like to thank the rest of the parents for putting up with the jam packed schedule which at times saw us play games on six consecutive days and nine games in ten days.

We had quite a range of ages and abilities between the 16 different players that suited up for us throughout the season. J.Rubin and H.Gargovic were two of our alternates, who while they did not play Morton Grove Baseball during the Spring season, they were given the opportunity to play in the Summer, and each of them logged in at least 10 games. H.Gargovic, even in his limited action with the team, tied for the team lead in home runs with 3, which included a crushing home run shot over the fence at Flick Park on July 31st and another one over the fence at Crowley Park on August 12th.

C.Quinn was another alternate on the team who by season's end had played over 10 games. C.Quinn lived in Virginia during the Spring season and came to Morton Grove for the summer. After discovering his love for baseball off the field, as he was always at the park, practicing his pitching and hitting, he was invited to join the team and made great contributions. Even in his limited action with the team, he finished the season second on the team in hitting and on base percentage, logging a .615 batting average and a .681 on base percentage, while also finishing tied for 3rd on the team with 8 doubles. Additionally, C.Quinn contributed to the team as a pitcher, where he made six appearances on the mound.

Our final alternate was 11 year old Sk.LeVine. After being given the opportunity to play, Sk.LeVine took full advantage of it, playing some great defense at 2nd base as well as in the outfield. Facing pitchers who in some cases were 2 or 3 years older than him, Sk.LeVine was able to hold his own at the plate, going 6 for 19 on the season. During the last week of the season, Sk.LeVine also pitched 4 innings for Morton Grove and he pitched very well, even at the longer pitching distance.

During the Summer season, we had several 12 year olds rostered, each of whom was playing at the Pony field dimensions for the very first time. L.Pearlstein and V.Kabat each played in about half of the games during the

season and each saw improvement as the season went on. L.Pearlstein struggled at the plate during the regular season as he was adjusting to faster pitching and seeing breaking balls for the very first time. However, in his final at bat of the season, he logged his only extra base hit of the year as he crushed a two run double over the center fielder's head in what was a close game vs Glenview. V.Kabat, who had just 8 hits on the season, also finished very strong, recording 4 of his hits in the season ending double header on August 22nd. Both V.Kabat and L.Pearlstein were also given the opportunity to pitch during the season, and while it was a work in progress, the experience they got as 12 year olds will surely be valuable as they move forward into Pony baseball in the future.

Ry.Wiederer was another 12 year old on the team who quickly made the adjustment to Pony Baseball. Ry.Wiederer started the season red hot, batting nearly .900 after the first three games of the season! While he had hit some bumps in the road, Ry.Wiederer finished the season with a solid .441 batting average and was 4th on the team with 26 runs scored. Wiederer was also one of the frequent pitchers for Morton Grove, logging in 17 innings of work. At times Wiederer struggled on the mound, while at other times he was dominating. With more practice and more games under his belt, Wiederer will certainly be a quality pitcher as he moves into Pony baseball in the future. Additionally, Wiederer was one of the most versatile players in the field for Morton Grove, as he played all infield positions, a few innings at catcher, and even some innings in the outfield.

The team also rostered three 14 year old players in G.Pappas, S.Garcia, and K.Casanova, each of whom were playing some of their last games of Pony baseball before moving into the scary world of high school ball. It was a lot of fun to have Pappas on the team as he had played in four different teams in the past that I had also been a part of as an assistant coach or a manager. Pappas finished the season 5th on the team in batting with a .567 batting average. Pappas led the team with 35 RBI's and also led the team in doubles with 11.

K.Casanova was the center fielder for the team and almost any pop-up hit his way was a sure out. At the plate... it was a much different story as it was either hit or miss. Casanova had the second most strikeouts on the team, but when he hit the ball, it sure did go a long way. Casanova had 7 doubles on the year, 3 triples on the year, and 3 home runs on the season. This contributed to Casanova being 3rd on the team with 29 RBI's even after missing a few games.

S.Garcia was one of our primary catchers on the team and also a solid hitter. Garcia ended the season 3rd on the team with 8 doubles while batting .525. Garcia will be remembered on this team as the guy who just couldn't get enough baseball. Garcia was almost always one of the first to arrive at the baseball field and was always one to try to push the rest of the team to get to the field earlier so that they could take batting practice.

The rest of the team was made up of 13 year olds who originally played on my Spring team and then continued through Summer. W.Farrell, Jr., much like Garcia, was always one of the first to arrive at the ballpark. One of the season highlights for Farrell was his pitching performance on August 8th. Farrell hadn't pitched much in the Spring or Summer seasons but on this one day he was spot on. Farrell had pitched two innings, struck out 4 batters, and did not allow a single hit.

J.Kruk was the workhorse of the team, logging a team leading 22 innings on the mound. In addition to his great pitching, John was one of the team leaders at the plate, ranking 3rd on the team in hitting with a .585 batting average, 3rd on the team with a .662 on base percentage, and second on the team with 27 runs scored. Kruk was very versatile in the field as he played several innings at shortstop and third base, while also catching a few innings behind the plate, playing a bit of first base, and logging some innings in the outfield.

B.Gallas, who was the only player to have played in all 21 games during the summer, was the well established leadoff hitter for the team. Gallas led the team with 40 runs scored, 6 triples, and was 4th on the team with a .580 batting average. Gallas, who stepped to the plate 85 times during the season, struck out just a miniscule 5 times! Gallas, who did not get the opportunity to pitch much during the Spring season, threw 12 innings on the mound and this added experience will surely make him a regular pitcher come next Spring season.

Our final two players are what I believe were our most improved players. To.Dynek who was a good pitcher at the start of the Spring season, became one of the elite pitchers in the league by the end of the Summer season. The development of a curve ball and his great accuracy has given him several tools to become dominant on the pitcher's

mound. As great as the strides as he made on the pitcher's mound, Dynek might have been even better behind the plate, as he threw out countless runners on pickoff players at 3rd base as well as runners at 2nd and 3rd. Tom also saw improvement at the plate throughout the season. After getting off to a slow start, he worked his batting average up near .500 and also was second on the team in runs scored with 27.

Last but surely not least is Sh. LeVine. Sh. Levine played on my Spring season and finished the season with a less than stellar .314 batting average. However, after flipping the switch at the end of the Spring season, LeVine batted an unbelievable .714 on the year with an on-base-percentage of .743. LeVine also hit for power as he finished 2nd on the team with 10 doubles, and 2nd on the team with 4 triples. His 34 RBI's were also second on the team and his 48 hits on the season were by far the most. LeVine also was one of the best contact hitters for the team, striking out only 4 times through the entire season, which was the least amongst all regulars. In addition to his vast improvement at the plate, LeVine was also one of the leading pitchers for Morton Grove, having tossed 18 innings. Additionally, his versatility in the field gives him the MVP award for the team.

All in all, I couldn't have asked for a better Summer season. Of our 21 games, 19 of them were decided by 6 runs or less, with several of them coming down to the final out of the game. There were a lot of memorable moments on the field, probably none more than our 3rd to last game of the year vs Wilmette. It was the bottom of the 7th, with Wilmette having the winning run at 1st base and Sk. LeVine on the mound. It was a hard hit ball to J. Kruk at shortstop who flipped to Ryne at 2nd base, who then tossed to 1st base for a game ending double play, which gave us the one run victory. I sure hope that each of you will have that one game, one at-bat, one hit, or one play in the back of your mind for years to come that reminds you of this Summer season. For the younger kids, I believe the added experience of this league will make you much better ball players for years to come. For the older, more experienced players, I wish you luck in any of your future endeavors, whether they be on the field or off the field.

For me personally, this league has taught me a lot about myself and my coaching ability. I have learned a lot from fellow coaches, from the players, and from just watching the games. I sure hope to have the opportunity to coach future teams and this experience will certainly make me a better coach for years to come. Lastly, I'd like to think that this team was not only about me helping coach the players, but also, friendships that were formed between myself and the players and parents, that I hope to carry on for years to come.

GAME NOTES: A nearly three-hour offensive explosion between these two teams that saw at least 2 runs scored in 11 of the 14 half innings played.
