MID-SUMMER TOURNAMENT

On Saturday, August 7, we had a round-robin tournament at James Park 3 and 4. Below are the rules for the tournament. Unfortunately, after playing one game, the Ken-Winn Yankees bowed out of the tournament.

RULES: The Rules of Major League Baseball, as modified by the NSYBA Summer Ball Local Rules (both available at www.nsyba.org), except as further modified below:

FORMAT: Each team will play every other team once, for a total of four games per team. The Evanston Eagles and Ken-Winn Yankees will play three games only. Each game will be three innings, and no half-inning can begin later than 50 minutes after the start of the game. Each game ends one hour after it begins. Ties after three full innings will stand as ties — no fourth innings. Games start promptly at 9:00 AM, 10:10 AM, 11:20 AM, 1:00 PM and 2:10 PM.

FORFEITS: There are no forfeits. If a team has fewer than nine players, it will borrow enough players from its opponent to field the eight defensive positions. The borrowed players will be the last batted outs unless any of the last batted outs are scheduled to pitch in that game. No team may borrow a pitcher from another team.

PITCHING RULES: There are no age restrictions on pitchers within each game. No pitcher may pitch more than four innings total, and all pitchers are restricted to consecutive innings only. Thus, you can have a pitcher pitch a three-inning complete game then pitch the first inning of the next game. But you cannot have a pitcher pitch, say, two innings in game 1 then two innings in game 3.

THE ROSTER: Continuous roster batting is the rule. Your leadoff batter in the next game is the player in your batting order immediately after the last out in the previous game. Late arrivals get inserted at the bottom of your batting order. Departing players are scratched, and should they return to the tournament, they are inserted at the bottom of your batting order, not in their previous position in the order.
