GAME NOTES: Both managers agreed during the 5th inning that the game would be called after 6 innings due to time.

What a game to kick off the Fall Ball season for the Skokie Indians Classics. It was a 3-hour marathon that saw the weather change more frequently than each half inning. With light rain and then heavy rain, followed by a short period of picture perfect weather, the conditions were not the most ideal. The Classics jumped on the board right away hammering five consecutive singles to the start the season, courtesy of C.Benesch, L.Saliba, M.Friend, T.Donahue, and T.J.Casem. The Evanston Firefighters fought right back putting up 9 runs in the first two innings and shutting down the Classics in the second to take a 9-4 lead. The teams exchanged a few runs over the next several innings and the Firefighters held an 11-8 lead heading into the final inning.

The Classics put a 5-spot on the board thanks to a number of walks and two crucial hits by Z.Bauer and L.Saliba. With a two-run lead, M.Friend came out to pitch the final inning to close out the game. Friend was able to induce 4 of the first 5 hitters to hit ground balls in the infield, but poor defensive plays by the Classics allowed 3 of these batters to reach base. The Firefighters put two runs across to tie the game and had the winning run at 2nd base with just 1out. The Wilmette Mud Hens jumped out to an early lead with five consecutive hits by S.Tanner, K.Schulze, C.Wojcik, G.Soman, and E.O'Connell, putting up 5 runs in the first inning while recording just 1 out. The Skokie Indians Classics battled right back doing one better, putting up 5 runs of their own without recording a single out. T.J.Casem hit a bases-clearing double in the first to tie the ball game at 5 runs each. The scoring settled down dramatically from this point forward, with only 3 runs scored in total over the next 5 innings of play. Z.Bauer pitched two great innings for the Classics, facing just 7 batters without giving up a single hit. C.Benesch also pitched two strong innings without giving up any earned runs. R.Wiederer pitched the last two innings of the game striking out 3 batters and keeping the Mud Hens scoreless.

The Mud Hens led the game 7-6 going into the last inning. T.Dynek led off the inning for the Classics with a walk, putting the tying run on base. After R.Wilson hit a slow groundout to the right side of the infield, the tying run moved into scoring position. After the next batter recorded an out, the Classics were down to their final out. L.Saliba drew a walk, putting the winning run on base. R.Wiederer then hit a walk-off double over the right fielder's head to grab the 8-7 victory.
